A motion was made by Ron Steele to accept the resignation of Amy Scott as the Parking Officer effective February 22, 2017. Seconded by Royce Lorentz, motion carried.

A motion was made by Ron Steel to approve the quote from Bronder Technical Services of \$ 1,546.66 to remove the damaged light pole by Kwik Fill and move the luminaire from this light to the light pole by the Marathon Station. Seconded by Steve Saylor, motion carried.
